

#### What is JSPS:

- It is Japan's core funding agency.
- It places high value on both researcher autonomy and research diversity.

#### What does JSPS support:

- From basic to applied research conducted based on the free ideas of researchers.
- The entire spectrum of academic fields including the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.

#### **Application Selection:**


- Bottom-up approach; invite applications through open calls.
- Competitive funding; evaluate through peer review.
- Fair and transparent screening; select based on academic merit.

#### **International programs:**

- Focus placed on mobilizing researchers.
- Aimed at establishing robust international cooperative networks.
- Travel expenses covered and international fellowships provided.


#### Number of Researchers Exchanged under JSPS Programs

## Who can apply for JSPS RONPAKU program?

#### **Eligibility**

\*Excerption of important parts from application guideline

#### The candidate must be a researcher

- (1) Who has NOT obtained a PhD degree
- (2) Who is employed <u>full time</u> at a university or research institution as a researcher
- (3) Who is 45 years of age or younger\* \*as of 1 April 2020

# How to apply Fellowship and RONPAKU




- Find your host researcher in Japan
  - →Your host researcher needs to submit your application (Fellowship and RONPAKU) to JSPS
- Who can be your host researcher?
  - →Researcher who is working at universities or research institutions as a full-time researcher.
  - →No nationality limit




